NO FEAR Part 2 - Kingdom Identity

While it might make a good movie plot, I somehow don't think Jesus had in mind that we would go through the whole of our lives hiding our identity, only to have it revealed at the last moment that we were a disciple of Jesus!

I think that kind of understanding and approach to faith comes from a misunderstanding of who we are when we are in a relationship with Jesus.

Your answer makes all the difference...

The Greatest Trick...

Fear paralyses our purpose.

Fear is just a counterfeit of the fear of God.

But how does that work out in practice?

A Person Can't Change What They Are...

Who we are at the core of ourselves, and what we believe about that, makes all the difference. Why this is a challenge, it's because the world thinks that's true – and it is to a certain degree. Inside, we can't change ourselves.

This is where our identity is absolutely key to dealing with fear in our lives.

God breaks fear in us when He makes us His children.

The amount of fear in your life right now is directly proportional to your proximity to Jesus.

Our identity is a weapon in our hands. Our identity is the tool that God gives us to fight back the advances of the world, the enemy, the things that set themselves up in opposition to the kingdom of God and His purposes for our lives.

Our identity then determines our activity.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Has thinking about fear paralysed God's purpose for your life brought any clarity to areas where you are dealing with fear?
- 2. What are those areas where fear is stopping you responding to God's invitation to go deeper?
- 3. What do you really believe to be true about you? Don't just give a Bible answer, but be vulnerable: what are the things that you really believe?
- 4. Whose voice is that truth coming from? Is it God, or the enemy, or the world? Remember the Bill Johnson quote: "God and the devil are asking you the same question: Who do you think you are?"
- 5. How have you seen 'new creation' expressed in your life? What is new since you met Jesus?
- 6. How does it change the way you approach life, knowing that in Jesus you are a child of God?
- 7. What element of your identity is God offering to you as a weapon or tool in the season you are in?
- 8. Spend some time reflecting on the truths listed above. Which one stands out to you? Which one is God prompting you to really grab a hold of over the next short season? Pray for yourself, or others in a group setting, about these areas.
