ONE FROM THE HEART – Jesus and Prayer

Why Pray?

As Christians, why is it that we need to pray? Does our prayer life please God? Does our time praying prove to others how holy we are? Does the time spent praying matter to God? Why pray?

The Gospel of Matthew contains over 50 direct links to the ministry of Jesus and prayer. From angelic visitations, to healings and deliverances, to teachings on the subject of prayer and even personal prayers of Jesus.

The Conception of Prayer

Matthew 3:16-4:2

Prayer begins in relationship with Our Father.

Prayer requires our dependency and faith.

"Satan would rather we let the grass grow on the path to our prayer chamber than anything else" – E.M. Bounds

The Content of Prayer

You can tell a lot about your theology, by the way you pray.

What is the content of your prayers?

The Lord's Prayer has been turned upside-down by the Western church...

"Deliver us from the evil one. Lead us not into temptation. As we have forgiven our debtors, forgive us our debts. Give us today our daily bread. On earth as it is in heaven, Your will be done, Your Kingdom come. Hallowed be your name, Our Father"

The content of our prayer comes from a correct view of God. When we view God correctly, our prayer becomes informed and powerful.

In the Lord's Prayer, we may find at least five types of prayer; Adoration, Intercession, Petition, Confession and Spiritual Warfare. This is no 'magic formula' for prayer, but it is a framework that the Lord has given us, which will help us form the content of our prayers.

- + Adoration Praising God for who He is and what He has done
- + Intercession Asking God to move, intervene, redeem and save
- + Petition Bringing everyday needs before God
- + Confession Repenting of sin
- Spiritual Warfare Pushing back the work of the devil through faithfilled prayer

"The Lord's Prayer is the most perfect of prayers... In it we ask, not only for all the things we can rightly desire, but also in the sequence that they should be desired. This prayer not only teaches us to ask for things, but also in what order we should desire them." Thomas Aquinas

The Confidence of Prayer

"But when they arrest you, do not worry about what to say or how to say it. At that time, you will be given what to say, for it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you."

Matthew 10:19-20

Prayer precedes mission and prayer sustains mission.

As we grow in prayer, we grow in confidence to boldly seek Him and His kingdom here on earth as it is in Heaven.

Prayer isn't one of the things we do, it's the most important thing we do.

"Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings."

Hebrews 10:19-22
